The Ambassadors of Harmony (AOH) is one of the premier men's a cappella choruses in the world. Known for powerful and musically masterful performances, AOH offers a diverse repertoire drawing from barbershop, jazz, pop, broadway, folk, classical, and holiday favorites. Founded in 1963 by 26 members who called themselves the Daniel Boone Chorus, AOH has grown to more than 100 singers, has produced eight recordings, won numerous awards, and has entertained audiences across the United States and in Canada, England, Germany, Ireland, Sweden and the Netherlands. Every man in AOH seeks to change the lives of the people for whom they sing through artistic and emotionally-driven performances.



ABOUT ™AMBASSADORS HARMONY



The chapter was founded in 1963, when a call went forth with the colorful introductory statement: "Calling all bathtub baritones." The first meeting of the new Daniel Boone Chorus occurred January 22, 1963. The chorus began competing in the annual Central States District Chorus Contest, typically finishing toward the bottom, placing tenth in 1972, eleventh in



1973, ninth in 1975, and eleventh again in 1978 and 1979. The eleventh-place finish in 1979 was last place. In 1981 a mathematics professor from Washington University in St. Louis joined the chorus, became its director, and promptly began making changes. Jim Henry described what happened as a result: "Then something incredible happened that changed everything. It stirred us like a tornado. Its name was David Wright." David came to us with a vision that the Daniel Boone Chorus could actually become a great singing ensemble, and

began to raise the level of expectations. Within two years the chorus had grown to 70 members. The change showed measurable results in 1982, with a second-place finish in the district contest. In 1989, the Daniel Boone Chorus made its International Barbershop Chorus Competition debut in Kansas City, Missouri, with 77 men on the risers and finished in sixth place.



Wright handed the directorship to Jim
Henry in 1990. The chorus rebranded
itself the Ambassadors of Harmony in 1991 and continued
its march to excellence, placing fourth in 1994. The chorus
won its first gold medal in 2004 then again in 2009 and
2012. In 2013 the chorus welcomed Jonny Moroni as codirector. Combined with a great leadership and dedication
to excellence, the Ambassadors of Harmony brought home
a fourth gold medal in 2016.

Through it all our numbers have grown, our youth outreach initiatives continue to thrive, and our musical partnerships continue to expand. And 2019 promises more of the same. We're especially excited to partner with other choirs in presenting "Then Sings My Soul" an inspirational Gospel Concert to be presented in March, and to return to the International Competition stage in Salt Lake City, Utah in July. Our mixed youth chorus "The Recruits" is now an official chapter chorus thanks to the Barbershop Harmony Society's "Everyone in Harmony" initiative. The future may see us adding a women's chorus to our family as well. We are proud of how far we've come and can't wait to see what lies ahead. If you really just sit back and think about what we do, it's

pretty amazing. We can't wait to see what 2019 holds for this chorus!

THE AMBASSADORS OF HARM



The 2nd Annual Ambassadors of Harmony Foundation Gala was Feb. 17, 2018, and did it knock our socks off! We have been driving toward becoming a more arts-minded organization for several years, mostly by building connections with youth and schools in the St. Louis metro area. Our gala presented much of that story with an interactive video about some of the students who have benefitted from previous donations, and an appearance by the 2017 Acappellooza Summer Youth Chorus and the Recruits.

We have awarded a college scholarship for more than 20 years, and have run a fall music field trip called Acappellooza Fall since 2002. Since 2012, our youth outreach has grown exponentially with the creation of the youth chorus, The Recruits; a four-day summer camp, Acappellooza Summer; a quartet training program called Project Harmony; and most recently an a cappella festival called Acafest.

ONY FOUNDATION ANNUAL GALA

Altogether in 2018, AOH had more than 1,180 young singers take part in our music education projects. The various programs led to the creation of a foundation to seek partnerships in the community to expand our impact on helping young singers who struggle financially to fulfill their musical dreams. The foundation seeks to enable young singers to experience the joy of music that we ourselves feel.

With that in mind, we hosted our inaugural gala in 2017 to support the foundation, raising more than \$36,000 from 180 guests. Those funds broadened AOH's community footprint and helped lessen the financial strains of some youngsters attending our immersive summer program. We are thrilled to report that our second gala surpassed the first, and with the help of 244 donors, we raised more than \$56,000! Donations came in the form of silent and live auction items/purchases, monetary donations, seat reservations, and a paddle auction for scholarship donations.

Acappello za

Acappellooza Summer is an overnight a cappella music summer camp held at the University of Missouri-St. Louis (UMSL) for students in grades 9-12. During the four day camp, students are immersed in singing led by some of the world's most prominent names in a cappella music, including two-time gold medalists Dr. Jim Henry and Debbie Cleveland. In 2018, 167 coed students attended the 5th annual camp.

Acappellooza Fall is a two-day field trip for high-schoolers from all over Missouri and the Metro-East. Dr. Jim Henry and the Ambassadors of Harmony have been putting this together for 16 years, in partnership with the University of Missouri St. Louis, with help from the University Singers. This year, more than 1,100 students participated.

ACAFEST

In 2016, AOH launched AcaFest, a festival of high-school and college singers that gave local St. Louis groups opportunities to network and showcase their talents for an engaged audience. This year Acafest will be held on April 6th at Missouri Baptist University.

RMONY MUSIC EDUCATION PROGRAMS

Project Harmony

For several years, AOH has been working with students in various St. Louis-area schools to share our love of a cappella singing (primarily in the barbershop style) with students and teachers. Project Harmony takes contemporary a cappella music back to its roots by integrating tight harmonies and barbershop singing techniques into a year-long program in local schools.



Since 1997, the Ambassadors of Harmony have provided an annual college scholarship to local high school seniors. The \$1,000 scholarship is designed to encourage singers to continue pursuing vocal music education and is presented at AOH's annual concert in June.

RECRUITS

The Recruits chorus was formed in 2012 by AOH co-director Jonny Moroni to inspire, educate and provide choral opportunities for youth. Members benefit from performing before large audiences and receiving top-notch vocal instruction. In 2018 it welcomed new director, Eric Dalbey. In early 2019 the chorus became the first official BHS mixed chorus.





For the second year in a row, AOH hosted the Central States District contest in October right here in St. Charles, MO. Fortunately, we had ample preparation having hosted the district contest in 2017 as well. This year provided a new challenge for the chorus: hosting AND competing! Ultimately, 23 quartets

crossed the stage this year including six with members of the Ambassadors of Harmony. Fleet Street, whose members all have sung in AOH, took district gold. Three more **AOH-bred** quartets finished in the top 10. More than a dozen talented choruses also took part in the contest as well. AOH took first place, earning the society's No. 1 seed and a chance to represent the district at the 2019 international contest We were offered a unique opportunity to perform on a gospel-style concert with Sweet Honey in the Rock, a well-known African-American women's singing ensemble. When the internationally acclaimed, three-time Grammy winners visited our home venue in March, AOH was honored to open the show with our own gospel and a cappella style.
